Lua, who is currently in Kota Baru. said residents and members from the Chinese guilds had also gathered and helped out at the relief centre.

"We can reach Kuala Krai now and we are sending the food to them as well as those in Tanah Merah and Machang," he said via Skype.

At a cheque presentation yesterday, Liow thanked all the donors for their kind gesture in helping the victims.

The donors include 98-year-old Ng Soon Huat, a party veteran who gave RM85,000 to show his support, Tan Sri David Law (RM300,000), Malaysia Motorcycle and Scooter Dealers Association (RM133,000), as well as Tan Sri Lim Kang Hoo, Berjaya Air, Weststar and Pecca Leather that transported the flood relief items to the affected area by helicopters or lorries.
